- To be a reverent and responsible Altar Server at Saint Mary Parish
- To know when I am scheduled to serve, arrive at the Church on time and ready to serve (at least **20 minutes** before the liturgy begins) or find a substitute if I am not able to serve at my scheduled time.
- Check instruction sheet on the clipboard in the sacristy.
- Sign in on the schedule sheet.
- To pay attention to the celebrant during Mass and work with the Holy Spirit to carry out my responsibilities during Mass.
- To ask questions when I am unsure of something.
- To volunteer to serve if there are not enough servers present for a Mass that I am attending, even though I may not be scheduled.

Requirements to become an Altar Server:

Each Server must be a baptized Catholic who has received first Eucharist and plans to receive the sacrament of Confirmation by high school. The child must have completed 5th grade (with some exceptions). He/she must be able to sit still, not fidget on the sanctuary and must not draw any attention. The best altar servers are those that the congregation doesn't notice at all.

A high school experienced server with adult supervision will conduct the training session the week of the new server's first scheduled assignment. Schedules are sent out quarterly via email by Mrs. Seidl. Because there it is difficult finding enough servers for some Masses, servers will be rotated for all Mass times. On average, a server is assigned a minimum of two Masses within a quarter. If a server cannot serve on certain dates due to other commitments, he or she is responsible for informing the scheduler before the schedule is prepared.

If a server is going to be absent from an assigned Mass due to illness, or family change of plans, he or she is responsible to find a substitute and inform the scheduler (Mrs. Seidl) of the change. This should be done a week or more before the date of the scheduled Mass. Most servers use email to request subs.

Please note: Any individual that misses two Masses will no longer be eligible to participate as an Altar Server.
